Webinar Abstract (pending SVMA, CVBC, AbVMA-approval for 1 hour CE Credit):

COVID-19 highlighted the potentially devastating effects of emerging infectious diseases. It wasn't the first emerging disease and it won't be the last. Veterinarians are confronted with infectious disease challenges regularly and many of the infectious diseases we deal with today were not present or recognized even a few years ago. Various factors create an ever-present risk of new disease emergence or expansion of the ranges of current disease. This talk will discuss a variety of emerging and re-emerging veterinary (and zoonotic) infectious disease issues that veterinarians may encounter.

Speaker Biography: Dr. Scott Weese, a veterinary internist & microbiologist, is a professor at the OVC & a Zoonotic Disease/Public health Microbiologist at the University of Guelph's Centre for Public Health and Zoonoses. He is Chief of Infection Control at the OVC Teaching Hospital and holds a Canada Research Chair in zoonotic diseases. Dr. Weese has authored/co-authored over 200 papers in peer reviewed journals, edited two books & speaks extensively on infectious disease topics. His research interests include *Clostridium difficile*, microbiome assessment, surgical site infection, antimicrobial resistance, methicillin-resistant staphylococci, infection control, emerging diseases & zoonoses & he is the host of the popular Worms and Germs blog!
